

Field Note

March 10, 1966

Corral Creek, Tributary to WB Russian River, Mendocino County, from mouth upstream to the headwaters.

Observations :

Flows - estimated 4 to 5 cfs-clear

Importance - Possible spawning area for steelhead and silver salmon.

Miles of stream available - Approximately 3/4 miles of which only 15% available for spawning.

Summer conditions - Goes dry in the summer.

Fish present - None observed or seized. Local residents say that it is the exception to find spawning fish present in this stream.

Shelter - Poor throughout.

Recommendations

1. Complete stream survey at time when conditions are best for finding fish present.
2. Evaluate summer stream condition. Find out when stream goes dry and its affects on fishlife.

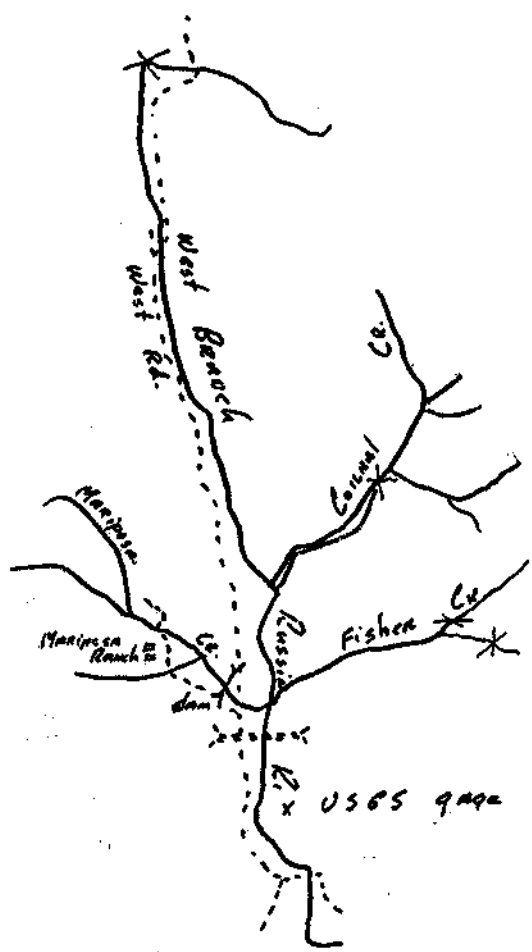
